Another good example...eyes looks natural; picture is not destroyed too much. Result: it's awesome.

Picking quality original photos is 50% of success. So never pick blurry or bad quality original photos.

As you can see those pictures are the last 7 pictures from mr. "Fancap". I did not pick his 7 best pictures. This is his ordinary or average quality. So please, in the future use these advices as a guide for making **great photos.**

***NOW....LET'S SEE SOME BAD EXAMPLES***

I understand that sometimes we don't have much creativity or it's simply not working out. But let's try to avoid photos like these by following these simple rules.

This editor is normally pretty good. But our pages are called "moronFACE" so the face should be more visible! Simply skip pictures like this. I will erase them...



The original photo is too blurry, pretty bad moronization...In the future I will immediately reject photos like this.

Never, but never make such unnatural photos. Eyebrows are just two lines, blurry eyes... The overall impression is bad.



This picture is simply not funny. SO this picture has actually no value for me, for him or for our visitors. For nobody!

Not funny...at least not to me!



Not so bad but eyes need to be alive. Not blurry!



Not bad moronization but the original photo is too blurry. Maybe the faces are too small.

Before morphing, always try to sharpen the original photo. Tweak the original photo quality a little so the quality of the morphed photo will look better than the original.



Making unnatural eyes is enough to make the photo not look funny, and our visitor will not be happy.



I do not want to see alien eyes or ugly zombies without any sense. This girl will cry when she sees herself. Show some creativity and make that person laugh in the end. Let her be thrilled and tell her friends about us.

The original photo is perfect but the moronization is bad.

Not bad moronization but the overall picture quality is nothing special. You should also try to improve the quality of the original photo first and then moronize it. Try to sharpen, adjust levels, colors, contrasts and so on...



Bad original photo, the picture has been destroyed, lips are blurred and nose is hardly visible. Ok, it's not so bad...but it can be much better...



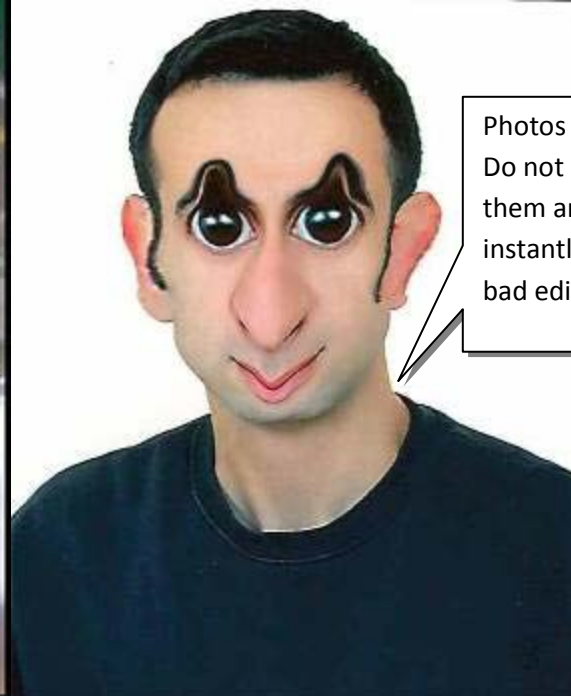
I know this is the easiest thing to do, "zoom" the face and upload the photo on to our site. Ahhh...
